## Eye in the Sky Protecting Handsworth

Recently, the Air Operations Unit worked with the Mosborough and Woodhouse Safer Neighbourhood Team to tackle crime and antisocial behaviour around the shops and pubs on Handsworth Road and nearby streets. This collaborative working saw a reduction in reports of that nature, and provided a visible and high profile deterrent to those intent on causing problems. The helicopter is based at the old Sheffield Airport, so this means that these patrols can continue in future as they leave their base or return at the end of a flight. ## Safeguarding Handsworth Road

Officers from the Woodhouse and Mosborough Safer Neighbourhood Team, (SNT) have developed a Crime Reduction Plan for the row of shops on Handsworth top, which have been repeat victims of burglary. Shop owners were invited to a meeting in December to discuss the plan, however the turnout was disappointing. Nevertheless, we will continue with our increased uniformed and plain-clothes patrols in the area as part of our ongoing "Operation Affield." We have also worked with the Handsworth Forum to install a CCTV camera.

## Cleaning up the Streets

Following requests from residents, the team have also worked with the Sheffield Environmental Enforcement Team to ensure new "No Dog Fouling" signs have been put up around Ballifield. We will continue with joint dog fouling and litter patrols in conjunction with Environmental Enforcement Officer.

## Targeting Off Road Bikes

We continue to crack down on nuisance off road bikes and have recently issued a formal warning to a male in Handsworth, after acting upon information from local residents. The small trials bike had been ridden around Ballifield and Church Lane.

## South East Community Assembly

We'd like to introduce our new Environmental Enforcement Officer, Chris Lukins. Chris's role will be to investigate environmental issues that are reported through to the assembly and to patrol the South East and take action accordingly.



Chris Lukins - E.E.O.

Below is a summary of some of the work Chris will be doing,

- Issue Fixed Penalty Notices (£75.00) for littering offences seen
- Issue Fixed Penalty Notices (£50.00) for Dog fouling offences seen
- Report graffiti to be removed
- Issue Fixed Penalty Notices (£50.00) to anyone seen affixing Fly Posting
- Visit shops/businesses regarding their trade waste management, i.e. overflowing bins etc
- Attend community groups, clubs, TARA's and other public meetings to promote what he can do
- Attend walkabouts where multi agency partners meet
- Be a contact for reporting any issues relating to the Streetscene that may have gone wrong...i.e. Defective street lighting, overflowing street litter bins, overgrowing hedges, arranging litter picks, damaged street furniture and other issues relating to the streets and roads
- Get involved with investigating fly tipping working with the Environmental Enforcement Officer for that area
- Work with private land owners to arrange for them to clear any fly tipping from their land and help advise for future prevention
- Affix dog fouling signage and spray on pavement signs
- Work with schools to educate pupils about littering and arrange with schools to have 'Litter pick fines', rather than Fixed Penalty Notices
- Provide a uniformed presence for the public, approachable and friendly to listen and help people with their local issues.
